7. Some courses may require prerequisite or corequisite. The prerequisites can be fulfilled with the student's completion of study at home university with the transcript as proof. The corequisite can be fulfilled with enrolling in the corequisite during the same semester/term.
8. **While the catalog includes all the majors and courses provided, the course offerings in a specific term may be varied or limited.** From time to time courses may be added or dropped from a curriculum. All courses listed in this catalog cannot be offered each semester. For example, some courses listed in the catalog may be offered only in the Spring semester; some courses listed in the catalog may be offered only in the Fall semester; some courses in the catalog may be offered in both Spring and Fall semester. 9. **Course Credit Hour System:**
A normal student load is 12 to 17 credit hours. One credit hour is equivalent to one hour (50 minutes minimum) of lecture and two (2) hours of out-of-class work each week. One typical course is three (3) credit hours. One course could be one (1) to five (5) credit hours.
10. **Course Numbering System:**
The system of course numbers is arranged to indicate the level of instruction. The first figure in each number designates the group to which a course belongs:

Numbering	Description
1000-1990	Courses open primarily to freshmen
2000-2990	Courses open primarily to sophomores
3000-3990	Courses open primarily to juniors
4000-4990	Courses open primarily to seniors
8000-9990	Courses open only to graduate students

Course Modality

UNO offers an array of modalities:

- “In-Person instruction” referring to instructors and students attending synchronous classes on our campus, or, in the case of practicum, field work, internships, service learning, or flight training, at community locations, subject to public health conditions. (001 sections)
- “Remote instruction” referring to instructors and students meeting synchronously using digital technology (eg: Zoom) at the scheduled times according to the Registrar’s calendar. (820 sections)
- “Hybrid instruction” referring to a mix of in-person instruction and either remote or online instruction, with reduced contact time on campus. (860 sections)
- “Online instruction” referring to asynchronous instructor-student interactions using digital technology, with students able to interact with each other and the instructor at flexible hours. (850 sections)
