Are Cradle-to-Grave Systems Still Viable in Advanced Economies *	Fellow Profile: Young professionals from a variety of backgrounds (representatives of governments, in particularly finance and economy ministries, as well as ministries dealing with social issues, representatives of parliaments, social and economic scientists, representatives of health care and pension industry, journalists, civil society organizations)
May 4–9, 2013	Open for Business: Building Platforms for Trust in Central and South-Eastern Europe *	Fellow Profile: Leaders from the private sector with interests in Central/Southeastern Europe, including international and local/regional business representatives; government representatives, policy-makers and influencers; civil society organizations including those focused on transparency and open government.
June 2–7, 2013	LGBT and Human Rights: New Challenges, Next Steps *	Fellow Profile: The session is open to a broad range of experts, dealing with and interested in LGBT and human rights in the 21st century. We invite participants from all regions of the world, particularly also from non-Western countries. Fellows would include: Lawyers and law makers; Political and community leaders; Representatives of human rights organizations; Representatives of LGBT cultural and political organizations; Representatives of religious groups; Film-makers, artists and writers. There will be a particular emphasis on younger leaders who will be making change into the middle of this century.

August 19–22, 2013	Out of the Shadows: Should Non-Banking Financial Institutions be Regulated? *	Fellow Profile: a broad range of experts, dealing with financial regulation issues, including regulators, bankers, economists, lawyers, scholars from academic institutions and think tanks, economic and financial journalists and other professionals from a wide geographical area
September 15–20, 2013	Shrinking Horizons: Better Health Care for the Elderly in a Cash-Strapped World *	Fellow Profile: health policy makers or those involved in implementation; health practitioners; those involved in health insurance or other forms of finance; media people specializing in health and health care

They will come from all continents and represent a broad spectrum of cultural expression and artistic endeavor – from dance, music, and theater to visual media, museums, cultural heritage institutions, and festivals. The Fellows are emerging leaders in their fields, with a strong interest in strengthening the position of arts institutions within their societies and in becoming active members of a global network.
